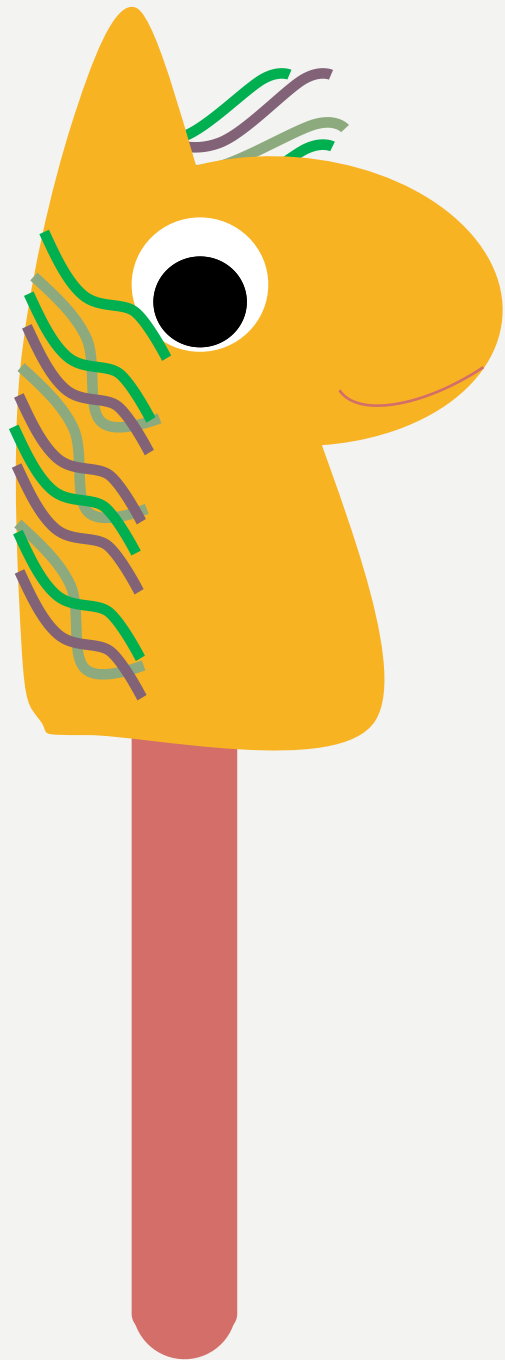

Colored paper (optional)

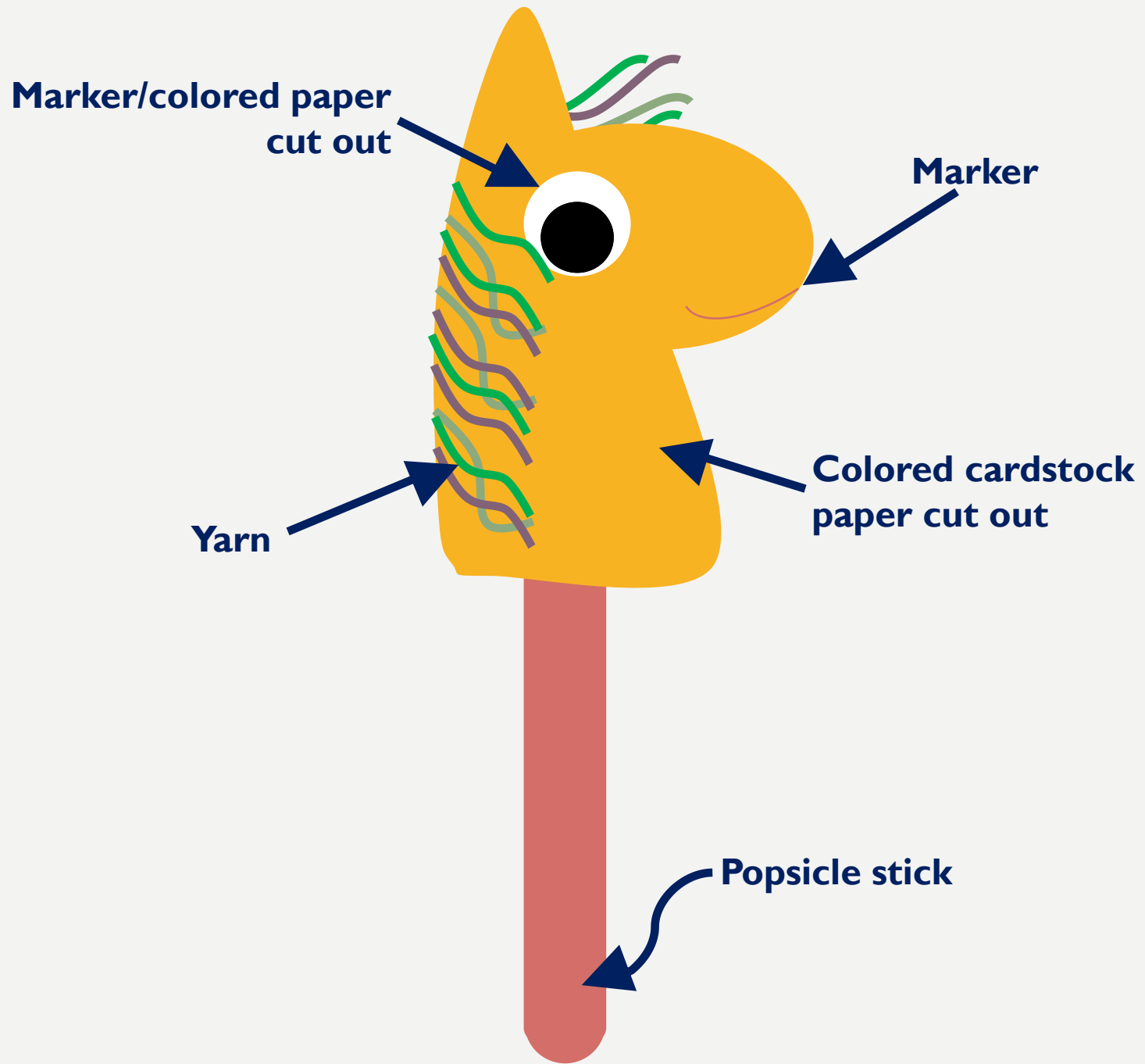
Markers

Cut out two circles and glue them to create the eye. You can also use markers to color in the eye and draw the mouth.



INSTRUCTIONS

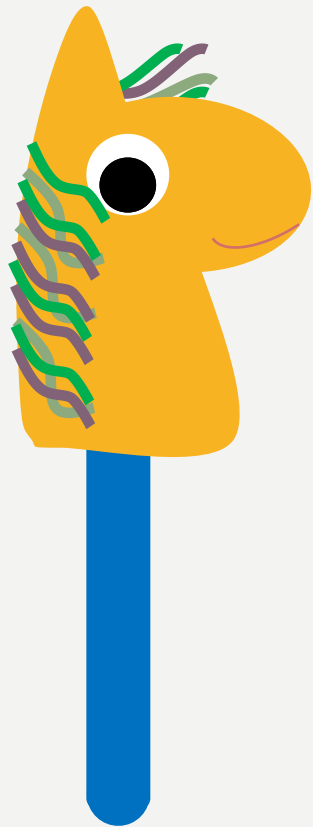


Cut out little pieces of yarn and glue them to the sides and top of the horse head.



INSTRUCTIONS

Using markers color the popsicle stick and glue it to the back of the horse head. You can also use tape to attach it.
