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#### ROAD TO KENTUCKY DERBY CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES HEADS TO TAMPA BAY DOWNS

**LOUISVILLE, Ky.** (Thursday, March 10, 2022) – The Road to the Kentucky Derby Championship Series will make its final stop at Tampa Bay Downs on Saturday where **Kentucky West Racing** and **Clarke Cooper**'s two-time winner **Classic Causeway** tops a field of 12 3-year-olds that entered the 42<sup>nd</sup> running of the \$400,000 Tampa Bay Derby (Grade II).

The 1 1/16-mile Tampa Bay Derby will go as Race 11 of 12 with a post time of 5:23 p.m. (all times Eastern). Tampa Bay Downs' first post is 12:15 p.m. The Tampa Bay Derby will award 85 points, split between the top 4 finishers on a 50-20-10-5 scale, toward the \$3 million Kentucky Derby presented by Woodford Reserve (GI).

Classic Causeway, who won the \$250,000 Sam F. Davis (GII) in his last start at Tampa, drew post No. 4 for Saturday's affair. Trained by **Brian Lynch**, Classic Causeway began his career with a debut win on Sept. 4 at Saratoga. The chestnut colt, who is by the late Giant's Causeway, finished third as the 9-5 favorite in the \$500,000 Breeders' Futurity (GI) at Keeneland. In his next start, Classic Causeway was second-best to **Smile Happy** in the \$400,000 Kentucky Jockey Club (GII) at Churchill Downs. **Irad Ortiz Jr.**, who rode Classic Causeway in the Sam F. Davis, will have the return call.

"We've been fortunate to not miss a beat with him," Lynch said. "He has had two strong workouts (since the Sam F. Davis) and he's on schedule to go back to a track he really liked.

"He came out of the (Sam F. Davis) very well, he's carrying good weight and he has great energy so we're counting our blessings. He seemed to really like the racetrack so we thought the smart thing was to take him back over there and have a crack at the Tampa Bay Derby."

Other top contenders that entered the Tampa Bay Derby include WinStar Farm and Siena Farm's \$300,000 Iroquois Stakes (GIII) winner Major General; Iris Smith Stable's Sam F. Davis runner-up Shipsational; West Point Thoroughbreds and Albaugh Family Stable's \$2 million Breeders' Cup Juvenile (GI) third-place finisher Giant Game; and Klaravich Stable's impressive debut winner Money Supply.

FORBIDDEN KINGDOM MADE OVERALL 5-1 FAVORITE IN POOL 4 OF KENTUCKY DERBY FUTURE WAGER; ECHO ZULU 4-1 CHOICE IN OAKS FUTURE WAGER – The fourth of five pools for the Kentucky Derby Future Wager ("KDFW") is set for its three-day stand Friday-Sunday with MyRacehorse and Spendthrift Farm's recent \$400,000 San Felipe (Grade II) winner Forbidden Kingdom tabbed by veteran morning line oddsmaker Mike Battaglia as the 5-1 favorite in the field of 24 betting interests.

Pool 4 of the KDFW will run concurrently with the lone pool of the Kentucky Oaks Future Wager ("KOFW"). In addition to Win and Exacta betting, an Oaks/Derby Future Double is part of the wagering menu. The wagers will open Friday at noon (all times Eastern) and the KDFW will close Sunday at 6 p.m. while the KOFW will close 30 minutes later at 6:30 p.m. Betting on the KDFW and KOFW is available at simulcast centers around the country and ADW's such as <a href="https://www.TwinSpires.com">www.TwinSpires.com</a>, the official platform for the Kentucky Derby and Churchill Downs Incorporated.

In the Kentucky Oaks Future Wager, **L** and **N** Racing and Winchell Thoroughbreds' brilliant filly **Echo Zulu** was made the 4-1 favorite in the field of 24 betting interests.

The speedy Forbidden Kingdom, trained by Hall of Famer **Richard Mandella**, was the even-money favorite in last Saturday's San Felipe where he dominated six rivals by 5 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> lengths. The San Felipe, which serves as the local prep to the \$1 million Santa Anita Derby (GI) on April 9, was the first time Forbidden Kingdom was tested around two turns.

Other top individual betting interests in Pool 4 of the KDFW appear to be **Winchell Thoroughbreds**' \$400,000 Risen Star (GII) winner **Epicenter** (8-1); **Tami Bobo**'s 3 ½-length winner of the \$400,000 Fountain of Youth (GII) **Simplification** (12-1); and **Lucky Seven Stable**'s \$400,000 Kentucky Jockey Club (GII) hero **Smile Happy** (6-1), who closed as the 8-1 individual favorite in the first three pools of the KDFW.

Overall, there are eight new interests in Pool 4: Whisper Hill Farm's 8 ½-length maiden winner Charge It (30-1); Gold Square's flashy allowance winner Cyberknife (50-1); Aaron Sones' Rebel (GII) runner-up Ethereal Road (50-1); Diamond T Racing, Blue Lion Thoroughbreds and Craig Taylor's \$300,000 Gotham (GIII) winner Morello (10-1); Sumaya U.S. Stable's Risen Star fourth-place finisher Pioneer of Medina (30-1); Iris Smith Stable's \$250,000 Sam F. Davis (GIII) runner-up Shipsational (50-1); Cypress Creek Equine's \$400,000 Rebel winner Un Ojo (50-1); and Barry and Joni Butzow's undefeated Zozos (50-1).

In the KOFW, Echo Zulu, trained by **Steve Asmussen**, is undefeated through four starts including a dominating 5 1/4-length victory in the \$2 million Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (GI). The daughter of Gun Runner has been steadily training toward her 3-year-old debut at Fair Grounds.

Another filly that is expected to garner betting interest is **Briland Farm**'s \$300,000 Honeybee (GIII) winner **Secret Oath** (6-1). Trained by Hall of Famer **D. Wayne Lukas**, Secret Oath has won her last three starts by a combined 23 lengths.

The Kentucky Derby and Kentucky Oaks Future Wagers provide fans of Thoroughbred racing with opportunities to place bets on possible entrants in the \$3 million Kentucky Derby presented by Woodford Reserve (GI) and \$1.25 million Longines Kentucky Oaks (GI) at odds that could be far greater and more attractive than those available on the day of the race. The 148th running of Kentucky Derby, America's greatest race and the first leg of the Triple Crown, is set for Saturday, May 7 at Churchill Downs. The Longines Kentucky Oaks will run one day earlier on Friday, May 6.

There are no refunds in the Kentucky Derby or Oaks Future Wager. Should Churchill Downs officials determine during the duration of this week's four-day pool that one of the wagering interests has experienced an injury, illness or other circumstance that would prevent the horse from participating in the Kentucky Derby or Oaks, betting on the individual horse will be suspended immediately.

Different from the first four pools of the KDFW, the fifth and final Pool 5 will run Thursday, March 31 and end prior to the first Road to the Kentucky Derby Championship Series race on Saturday, April 2.

OTHER 3-YEAR-OLD RACES TO WATCH – Repole Stable and St. Elias Stable's \$500,000 Champagne Stakes (GI) runner-up and \$2 million Breeders' Cup Juvenile (GI) fourth-place finisher Commandperformance will attempt to garner his first lifetime victory in a maiden special weight contest Saturday at Tampa Bay Downs. Trained by Hall of Famer Todd Pletcher, Commandperformance drew the outside post 8 with Irad Ortiz Jr. in the saddle. The gray son of Union Rags will add blinkers for this start, which is slated as Race 5 at 2:13 p.m. ET.

Another 3-year-old race Saturday that could have implications to the Road to the Kentucky Derby is Race 4 at Oaklawn where **WinStar Farm, CMNWLTH** and **Siena Farm**'s eye-catching 5 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>-length debut winner **We the People** will test allowance company. The field of six will head to post at 3:33 p.m. ET

FORBIDDEN KINGDOM, MORELLO, SIMPLIFICATION ADD 50 POINTS TO TOTAL FOLLOWING CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES VICTORIES – Last Saturday's quartet of races on the Road to the Kentucky Derby saw promising 3-year-olds Forbidden Kingdom (San Felipe), Morello (Gotham) and Simplification (Fountain of Youth) add to their point total toward qualifying for the \$3 million Kentucky Derby presented by Woodford Reserve (Grade I).

Magdalena Racing's Tiz the Bomb, the hard-fought winner of the \$125,000 John Battaglia Memorial, added 10 points in the closing race of the 21-race Prep Season.

The speedy Forbidden Kingdom, trained by **Richard Mandella** and owned in partnership by **MyRacehorse** and **Spendthrift Farm**, cruised to a 5 ½-length score in the \$400,000 San Felipe (GII) at Santa Anita. Earlier in the day, **Diamond T Racing**, **Blue Lion Thoroughbreds** and **Craig Taylor**'s Morello remained undefeated with a victory in the \$300,000 Gotham (GII). Also, **Tami Bobo**'s Simplification was able to avenge his runner-up finish in last month's \$250,000 Holy Bull (GIII) and drew clear late for a 3 ½-length win in the \$400,000 Fountain of Youth (GII).

#### **DOWN THE STRETCH:**

Trainer Todd Pletcher leads all conditioners with five victories in the Tampa Bay Derby: Limehouse (2004), Verrazano (2013), Carpe Diem (2015), Destin (2016), Tapwrit (2017). He's represented in this year's race by undefeated colt Major General. ...

Just two horses have run in the Tampa Bay Derby and went on to win the Kentucky Derby (GI): **Street Sense** (2007) and **Super Saver** (2010). Since the Tampa Bay Derby was instituted in 1982, it has produced 43 Kentucky Derby starters. ...

Since the Road to the Kentucky Derby Championship Series began in 2013, horses that have run in the Risen Star have the best average finish in the Kentucky Derby of 7.6. It's followed by the Louisiana Derby (8.2), Santa Anita Derby (8.5), Fountain of Youth (8.6), San Felipe (8.9), Florida Derby (9.9), Blue Grass (9.9), Rebel (10.3), Arkansas Derby (10.6), Tampa Bay Derby (10.8), Wood Memorial (11.6), UAE Derby (12.7), Jeff Ruby Steaks (13), Sunland Derby (13) and Gotham (13.3). (Note: the stat excludes the Lexington Stakes and additional races added in 2020 when the Kentucky Derby was moved to September). ...

TwinSpires.com Louisiana Derby (GII) contender **Epicenter** continued to work toward the 1 3/16-mile race with a swift five-furlong move in :59.60 Monday at Fair Grounds. He galloped out six furlongs in 1:13. ...

New York-bred **Shipsational** will attempt to become only the third horse out of the Empire State to win the Tampa Bay Derby. The lone two winners were **Big Truck** (2009) and **Champagneforashley** (1990). ...

Only two Tampa Bay Derby (GII) winners in the last 10 years broke their maiden in their previous start: **Tacitus** (2019) and **Ring Weekend** (2014). Recent maiden winners **Happy Boy Rocket** and **Money Supply** will attempt to accomplish that feat Saturday. ...

The last four winners of the Tampa Bay Derby were making their first start of their 3-year-old campaign: **Helium** (2021), **King Guillermo** (2020), **Tacitus** (2019) and **Quip** (2018). Only one horse in this year's Tampa Bay Derby field could add his name to that record and that's **Major General**, who makes his first start since winning the \$300,000 Iroquois (GIII) in September at Churchill Downs.

## ABOUT CHURCHILL DOWNS RACETRACK

Churchill Downs Racetrack ("CDRT"), the world's most legendary racetrack, has been the home of The Kentucky Derby, the longest continually held annual sporting event in the United States, since 1875. Located in Louisville, CDRT features a series of themed race days during Derby Week, including the Kentucky Oaks, and conducts Thoroughbred horse racing during three race meets in the Spring, September, and the Fall. CDRT is located on 175 acres and has a one-mile dirt track, a 7/8-mile turf track, a stabling area, and provides seating for approximately 60,000 guests. The saddling paddock and the stable area has barns sufficient to accommodate 1,400 horses and a 114-room dormitory for backstretch personnel.
