FILLY SECRET OATH TO TAKE ON BOYS IN \$1.25 MILLION ARKANSAS DERBY

\$1 Million Florida Derby, \$600,000 Jeff Ruby Steaks Also on Docket for Championship Series Saturday

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (Thursday, March 31, 2022) – Kentucky Derby fans across the world will be eyeing Hot Springs, Ark. on Saturday as outstanding 3-year-old filly **Secret Oath**, trained by 86-year-old Hall of Fame trainer **D. Wayne Lukas**, will take on the boys for a qualifying spot on the first Saturday in May in the \$1.25 million Arkansas Derby (Grade I) at Oaklawn Park.

Also on Saturday, horses in South Florida will attempt to stamp their name in the starting gate for the \$3 million Kentucky Derby presented by Woodford Reserve (GI) in the \$1 million Florida Derby (GI) at Gulfstream Park. In Kentucky, the winter season from Turfway Park will close with their premiere race, the \$600,000 Jeff Ruby Steaks (GIII), run over the Tapeta surface.

All three stops will award the top four finishing horse's points on a 100-40-20-10 scale. Typically, it takes between 30-40 points to qualify for the Kentucky Derby.

The Road to the Kentucky Derby was instituted in 2013 and since then, no fillies have qualified for the race. The last filly to run in the Kentucky Derby was **Devil May Care** in 2010.

In order for a filly to run in the Kentucky Derby, they have to earn points against open company. The points earned in races from that series will transfer to their Oaks point total should their connections decide to run them in the \$1.25 million Kentucky Oaks (GI) on Friday, May 6.

The Arkansas Derby will be televised as part of "America's Day at the Races" on FS1. The Florida Derby and Jeff Ruby Steaks will be shown on a special one-hour broadcast on CNBC from 6-7 p.m. Fans can bet all three races on www.TwinSpires.com, the official wagering provider of Churchill Downs and the Kentucky Derby.

FILLY SECRET OATH TAKES ON EIGHT RIVALS IN \$1.25 MILLION ARKANSAS DERBY – Briland Farms' homebred Secret Oath, who has dominated her filly competition in her last three starts, will test male counterparts as the 5-2 morning line favorite in Saturday's \$1.25 million Arkansas Derby (Grade I) at Oaklawn Park.

The Arkansas Derby is the final Road to the Kentucky Derby stop in the Natural State. The top four point earners in the 1 1/8-mile race will receive points on a 100-40-20-10 scale in an attempt to qualify for the \$3 million Kentucky Derby presented by Woodford Reserve (GI). The Arkansas Derby has a post time of 7:35 p.m. ET and was carded as Race 12 of 13 on Oaklawn's program.

Secret Oath has already stamped herself as one of the top contenders for this year's \$1.25 million Longines Kentucky Oaks (GI) but her owners and 86-year-old Hall of Fame trainer **D**. **Wayne Lukas** have opted to run her against colts in the Arkansas Derby. The last filly to win the Kentucky Derby was **Winning Colors** in 1988, who coincidentally was trained by Lukas.

In 1984, Lukas won the Arkansas Derby with Althea, just one week after she finished second in the Fantasy Stakes.

"(Secret Oath) has an extremely fast acceleration," Lukas said. "I saw how impressive she was in the Martha Washington and I wanted to see it one more time and we certainly did in the Honeybee. When the rail opened, she just broke their hearts because she was right to the leaders within three strides. It's not one of those prolonged strides, it's very quickly she gets going. Early on she was green and light and immature. I told the owners early on don't worry because she has a lot of talent. She got over the ground so well and was so efficient. Then I got ambitious and put her in the Golden Rod and that trip was horrendous. After I got her to Oaklawn and she settled down and everything has been perfect since."

Secret Oath will be ridden by **Luis Contreras**, who has been aboard the Arrogate filly in her last three starts. They'll break from post position No. 6

Other top contenders in the Arkansas Derby include \$400,000 Rebel (GII) winner Un Ojo; Gold Square's ultra-impressive allowance winner Cyberknife; WinStar Farm CMNWLTH & Siena Farm's undefeated We the People; and WSS Racing's multiple graded stakes placed Barber Road.

TAMPA BAY DERBY WINNER CLASSIC CAUSEWAY RETURNS ON SHORT REST IN \$1 MILLION FLORIDA DERBY – Kentucky West Racing and Clarke Cooper's \$400,000 Tampa Bay Derby (Grade II) winner Classic Causeway tops a field of 11 3-year-old colts that were entered in Saturday's \$1 million Florida Derby (GI) at Gulfstream Park.

The Florida Derby will award a total of 170 points to the top four finishers on a 100-40-20-10 scale towards a spot in the starting gate for the \$3 million Kentucky Derby presented by Woodford Reserve (GI). The 1 1/8-mile race will go as Race 12 with a post time of 6:38 p.m. Fans can watch the Florida Derby on a special 6-7 p.m. broadcast on CNBC and wager on www.twinSpires.com, the official wagering provider of Churchill Downs and the Kentucky Derby.

Classic Causeway has been brilliant so far in his 3-year-old campaign with front-running victories in the \$250,000 Sam F. Davis and Tampa Bay Derby. The son of the late Giant's Causeway has been the favorite in four of five lifetime starts. The only time he was not the post time favorite was his 6 ½-length maiden-breaking debut at odds of 13-1 where he upset a highly-regarded field of 2-year-olds at Saratoga.

"I think the timing of this race is going to work out a little better for us even though it's just three weeks from the Tampa Bay Derby," trainer **Brian Lynch** said. "This will give us five weeks until the Kentucky Derby and plenty of time when we ship back to Kentucky."

Classic Causeway and jockey Irad Ortiz Jr. will break from post No. 2.

Also entered in the Florida Derby field is **C2 Racing Stable** and **La Milagrosa Stable**'s lightly-raced \$250,000 Holy Bull (GIII) winner **White Abarrio**. Trained by **Saffie Joseph Jr.**, White Abarrio was the 4 ½-length winner of the Feb. 5 Holy Bull but Joseph opted to skip the \$400,000 Fountain of Youth (GII) in early March. The son of Race Day shipped to Churchill Downs to close his 2-year-old campaign where he finished third behind **Smile Happy** and Classic Causeway in the \$400,000 Kentucky Jockey Club (GII). **Tyler Gaffalione** will ride White Abarrio once again and the duo will break from post 7.

Tami Bobo's \$400,000 Fountain of Youth winner **Simplification** was made the tepid 5-2 morning line choice for trainer **Antonio Sano**. The three-time winner will be ridden by **Jose Ortiz** from post 3.

BATTAGLIA MEMORIAL WINNER TIZ THE BOMB RETURNS IN GRADE III, \$600,000 JEFF RUBY STEAKS – Magdalena Racing Lessee's \$125,000 Battaglia Memorial winner Tiz the Bomb headlines an oversubscribed field of 13 that were entered in Saturday's 51st running of the \$600,000 Jeff Ruby Steaks (Grade III) at Turfway Park.

The 1 1/8-mile Jeff Ruby Steaks, run over Tapeta surface, offers the winner 100 points on the Road to the Kentucky Derby Championship Series. The runner-up will receive 40 points while the third and fourth place finishers will tab 20 and 10 points, respectively. The Jeff Ruby Steaks will go as Race 12 with a post time of 6:23 p.m. Turfway will have a special early post of 12:45 p.m.

Tiz the Bomb, trained by **Kenny McPeek**, finished second in the \$1 million Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (GI). The son of Hit It a Bomb tried dirt to start his 3-year-old campaign but finished seventh in the \$250,000 Holy Bull (GIII). In his first start on Tapeta, Tiz the Bomb was able to hold off the late surge of **Stolen Base** in the 1 1/16-mile John Battaglia Memorial. Jockey **Brian Hernandez Jr.** has the call from post No. 7.

Also entered in the field is **Three Diamonds Farm** and **Deuce Greathouse**'s Stolen Base, who will add blinkers following his runner-up effort in the Battaglia; **Repole Stable** and **St. Elias Stable**'s Kittens Joy (GIII) runner-up **Royal Spirit**; **Winchell Thoroughbreds**' Texas Turf Mile winner **Red Run**; **Michael McLoughlin**'s Black Gold Stakes winner **Dowagiac Chief**; and **SF Racing**, **Starlight Racing**, **Madaket Stable**, **Siena Farm** and **Golconda Stable**'s **Blackadder**.

EPICENTER, ZOZOS RETURN TO CHURCHILL DOWNS TO BEGIN PREPARING FOR KENTUCKY DERBY – **Winchell Thooroughbreds**' TwinSpires.com Louisiana Derby (GII) winner **Epicenter** along with **Barry** and **Joni Butzow**'s runner-up **Zozos** returned to Churchill Downs early Tuesday morning to begin their preparation toward the \$3 million Kentucky Derby presented by Woodford Reserve (GI).

Epicenter earned 100 points for his Louisiana Derby victory, bringing his overall total to 164 points. Zozos tabbed 40 points for his runner-up effort.

Some of the other top Leaderboard moves from last weekend included UAE Derby (GII) winner **Crown Pride (JPN)** (100 points), Sunland Derby (GIII) winner **Slow Down Andy** (60 points) and UAE Derby runner-up **Summer Is Tomorrow** (40 points). DOWN THE STRETCH:

A competitive field of eight 3-year-old fillies are set to compete in the \$600,000 Fantasy (GIII) Saturday at Oaklawn. The field included \$400,000 Golden Rod (GII) winner **Dream Lith** and runner-up **Yuugiri** along with the dirt debut of \$125,000 Cincinnati Trophy winner **Bubble Rock**. Grade I winner **Eda**, who was the expected favorite in the race, will be scratched according to her trainer **Bob Baffert** due to a fever. The top 4 finishers of the Fantasy will receive points on a 100-40-20-10 scale toward the \$1.25 million Longines Kentucky Oaks (GI). Post time is 6:16 p.m. ET. ...

Susan Moulton's two-time winner and third-place finisher in the \$400,000 Golden Rod (GII), Sandstone, is set to make her 3-year-old debut in Saturday's 40th running of the \$250,000 Bourbonette Oaks at Turfway Park. Run at 1 1/16 miles on the Tapeta surface, the Bourbonette Oaks offers points on a 50-20-10-5 scale for the Kentucky Oaks. The Bourbonette Oaks will go as Race 11 at 5:43 p.m.

Winngate Stable's undefeated filly Kathleen O. tops Saturday's \$250,000 Gulfstream Park Oaks (GII). The 1 1/16-mile race will award the top 4 finishers points on a 100-40-20-10 scale towards the Kentucky Oaks. The Gulfstream Park Oaks has a post time of 5:17 p.m. ET. ...

UAE Derby (GII) winner **Crown Pride (JPN)** arrived from Dubai to Churchill Downs' Quarantine Facility on Wednesday afternoon. The colt could clear USDA Quarantine 42 hours after arrival, which would be around 8 a.m. on Friday. . . .

Louisiana Derby winner **Epicenter** returned to the track Wednesday morning and jogged about one-mile. The colt is familiar with Churchill Downs from his 2-year-old campaign. The four-time winner broke his maiden beneath the Twin Spires at second asking on Nov. 13. ...

Trainer **Ed Barker** reported Kentucky Derby contender **Shipsational** had to be withdrawn from Florida Derby contention due to a suspensory injury. He hopes the New York-bred colt will return at Saratoga. ...

The Cardinal Condition Stakes at Chelmsford City will be run Thursday at 1:45 p.m. ET. None of the horses who earned points on the European Road to the Kentucky Derby trail were early or late Triple Crown nominees. Therefore, no horses on the European leaderboard are expected to compete in the Kentucky Derby. ...

The final pool of the Kentucky Derby Future Wager will run Thursday-Saturday next week. The field will be announced Tuesday and close at 4:30 p.m. ET prior to the first Championship Series race run Saturday afternoon. ...

Training opened last Friday at Churchill Downs and several outfits have returned to Louisville including horses from the barns of Steve Asmussen, Phil Bauer, Mark Casse, Norm Casse, Brad Cox, Greg Foley, Michael McCarthy, Matt Shirer and Dallas Stewart. In total, there are about 350 horses on the grounds. ...

ABOUT CHURCHILL DOWNS RACETRACK

Churchill Downs Racetrack ("CDRT"), the world's most legendary racetrack, has been the home of The Kentucky Derby, the longest continually held annual sporting event in the United States, since 1875. Located in Louisville, CDRT features a series of themed race days during Derby Week, including the Kentucky Oaks, and conducts Thoroughbred horse racing during three race meets in the Spring, September, and the Fall. CDRT is located on 175 acres and has a one-mile dirt track, a 7/8-mile turf track, a stabling area, and provides seating for approximately 60,000 guests. The saddling paddock and the stable area has barns sufficient to accommodate 1,400 horses and a 114-room dormitory for backstretch personnel.
