LOUISVILLE, Ky. (Friday, April 19, 2024) - Churchill Downs and Fasig-Tipton have announced a new three-year partnership where the prestigious sales company will be the official sponsor of the La Troienne (Grade I), Fleur de Lis (GII) and Locust Grove (GII).

The Fasig-Tipton Locust Grove, run during the September Meet, has proven to be a crucial steppingstone to the Breeders' Cup Distaff with previous winners including Fasig-Tipton graduates Blue Prize (ARG), Search Results and Shedaresthedevil.
